^{*}The Pre-Medicine Post-Baccalaureate is a non-degree preparatory course of study for students who intend to apply for admission to Doctor of Medicine and other health care professional degree programs. As such, the students who complete their course of study generally continue their education in a professional degree program and do not seek employment upon completing the Pre-Medicine Post-Baccalaureate course of study. Consequently, the Placement Rate %, which is based on employment, is not reflective of the program's purpose of fostering further education in the medical and health care professions.

Of the 8 Graduates who completed their course of study in 2016, 7 enrolled in health care professional degree programs (87.5%), which includes 5 who enrolled in California Northstate University College of Medicine, and 1 who enrolled in California Northstate University College of Pharmacy. Of the 17 Graduates who completed their course of study in 2017, 13 enrolled in California Northstate University College of Medicine (76.47%), and 1 was accepted into California Northstate University College of Pharmacy but has not yet enrolled.

Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

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- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the
 applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the
 institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an
 examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination
 available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The Student's Right to Cancel provision from the Student Enrollment Agreement in effect for the class which entered the institution in the Fall Semester of 2016 is excerpted below:

"STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL AND REFUND:

You have the right to cancel this Student Enrollment Agreement until 12:01 AM on the first calendar day after the first classroom instruction session you attend (12:01 AM on September 1, 2016), or until 12:01 AM on the eighth calendar day after you sign this Enrollment Agreement, whichever is later.

Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation to the Admissions Office at the University's address shown at the top of the first page of this Enrollment Agreement. You can do this by hand delivery, email, facsimile, or mail. Written notice of cancellation sent by hand delivery, email, or facsimile is effective upon receipt by the Admissions Office. Written notice of cancellation sent by mail is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with postage prepaid.

If you cancel this Enrollment Agreement, the University will refund the amount of tuition that you paid not including the \$250.00 nonrefundable registration fee, within forty-five (45) days after your Notice of Cancellation is received by the Admissions Office. For students who purchase health insurance, the premium in the estimated amount of \$3,200.00 is set by the health plan, which is an outside provider, and will <u>not</u> be refunded unless the health plan provides a refund and, if so, then only according to the plan's terms."

Similar provisions are in effect for subsequent Enrollment Agreements.

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
